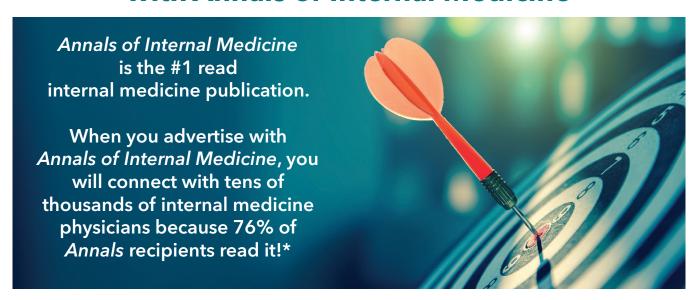

AbbVie has announced an agreement to acquire **Nimble Therapeutics**, including its lead asset, an investigational oral peptide IL23R inhibitor in preclinical development for the treatment of psoriasis.

Bristol Myers Squibb has received U.S. FDA approval for Opdivo Ovantig[™] (nivolumab and hyaluronidase-nhy) injection for subcutaneous use, a combination product of nivolumab co-formulated with recombinant human hyaluronidase (rHuPH20), in most previously approved adult, solid tumor Opdivo indications as monotherapy, monotherapy maintenance following completion of Opdivo plus Yerboy[®] (ipilimumab) combination therapy, or in combination with chemotherapy or cabozantinib.







A Day in the Life of a Therapy Dog

e made my day!" is a phrase I often hear throughout my work shifts. Patients, their families, healthcare providers, and staff alike say it to me, and it always makes me happy that I am pleasing others.

I'm Jack, a seven-year-old, 60-pound Goldendoodle, and I've been working as a therapy dog for two years with my owner, Kathy. Kathy and her family raised me from when I was a puppy. When Kathy saw the joy and smiles I brought to people, she knew I was something special.

BRINGING RELIEF AND JOY

Together, Kathy and I volunteer at Rutgers Cancer Institute in New Brunswick and The Cancer Center

at RWJ Hamilton, New Jersey. There, I visit patients while they receive cancer treatment infusions. I'm a welcome

distraction for them during those long hours, providing a little bit of relief from the pain, boredom, and sadness they may feel. The pediatric healthcare providers especially

appreciate me during the insertion process, which can be tough for kids.

We also volunteer at RWJ Barnabus Health hospitals, visiting patients and healthcare workers on the oncology, neurology, cardiac, and trauma floors. Sometimes, long-term patients who haven't seen their pets in months are moved to tears when they see me. They love petting and hugging me.

OUR WHY

Kathy's often asked what made her decide to volunteer with me as a therapy dog team. Her answer is simple – to bring joy, happiness, encouragement, and support to those who could use it the most. Many patients spend hours

alone while their loved ones are working, and some don't have family or friends nearby. Special friendships have formed during our weekly visits. We've been asked to continue visiting patients even after they're discharged, sometimes being part of hospice care teams or providing comfort to loved ones at wakes and funerals.

The healthcare providers often tell Kathy that they need me more than the patients do. The emotional toll on them can be overwhelming, and having weekly visits from an affectionate dog like me brings them immediate relief. Taking care of the healers can help them take better care of their patients.

SUPPORTING ANYONE AND EVERYONE

I meet so many different people - recovering drug addicts, incarcerated patients who haven't pet a dog in years, active and retired military personnel, and others who have lost hope or feel stressed. Sickness doesn't discriminate, and Kathy and I are honored to meet and help all these people.

Even though the days are long, I get a lot of love and

positive feedback. When I'm not working, you can find me napping in the hospital chapel, having a snack in the cafeteria, or performing tricks for medical school students.

Kathy and I volunteer three days a week, rotating between seven hospitals, cancer institutes, and senior living/memory care/hospice facilities. Therapy dogs like me can internalize some of the emotional stress from the people we visit, so Kathy makes sure to schedule "lighter"

had always wanted a cat, as I grew up with cats. I knew I wanted to make my dream of owning a cat a reality. So,



sat on my lap the whole time, and loved looking out the window.


FELINE FRIENDSHIP
